Diane worked as a Deputy D.A. for over thirty years and was instrumental in prosecuting animal abuse cases. Her talk will address the role that animal abuse plays in human abuse and homicides. Diane will clarify how "The Triad" (bed wetting, fire setting and animal abuse) precludes these heinous crimes.

**1:45PM Green River Killer Investigation
– Jon Mattsen**

Learn first-hand knowledge from one of the investigators in the Green River Killings. Detective-Sergeant Mattsen has been provided two-blocks in this conference to ensure attendees fully understand the dynamics, attitudes, investigatory efforts and consequences of this nationally recognized crime. Gary Ridgway killed 49 females in the 1980s and 1990s– mostly prostitutes in Washington, and dumped their bodies in the Green River.
